

In Kind Contributions:

In spite of the opinion of a former member of the Secretary of State's office, I have not found any authority that states that a candidate must report the value of endorsements received. I have researched the law and prior filings of other candidates and I find no support for the position that whenever an organization makes an endorsement and expends its funds to publicize its endorsement that a candidate must report the endorsers' expense as an in-kind contribution. In fact, such a position is untenable as the valuation issues would be problematic at best. What is the value of a newspaper's endorsement? The expense of publishing the paper on the day it runs? If that is the proper standard, then is the full cost of the press run for the days the endorsement runs the proper in kind valuation for each candidate? Or is each candidate responsible only for their portion of the production cost and should the cost be decided by the number of candidates that appear in the editorial? Or is it just the cost of producing the endorsement editorial and if so, does that include the man hours in interviewing the candidates. Basically, the point is that MANY organizations endorse candidates, from religious groups to newspapers to unions and the Chamber of Commerce. Each of these groups publicizes its endorsements to its membership or the general public and there is no way for a candidate to determine the value of such endorsements. Therefore, I have not included the expenditures made by any group that endorsed me as an in kind contribution.
